
Lewis Headache Center



EADACHE PAIN CAN lead a person to become fully incapacitated. This includes providing cutting-edge medications and therapies, in addition to a multidisciplinary wellness program with physical therapy, yoga, dietary consultations, and social work. While providing care to patients, Barrow headache specialists are also conducting innovative research to find better ways to diagnose, prevent, and treat headache disorders.

RESEARCH ADVANCEMENTS

The Lewis Headache Center has continued to expand its research program with four active clinical trials:

- A year-long extension study that evaluates the long-term safety and tolerability of an oral drug for the prevention of migraine in patients with chronic or episodic migraine.
- A study that tracks the standard of care for migraine patients and compares treatment responses from specific patient subpopulations.
- An interventional study that evaluates the efficacy and safety of the drug Vyepti in patients with episodic cluster headache.
- An observational study of headache patients' three-month response to external combined occipital and trigeminal nerve stimulation.

Headache neurologist Shane Root, MD, is also developing a study to examine the efficacy and tolerability of nerve block injections for the acute treatment of migraine, as well as their preventive effect over an extended period of time. This pilot study has never been tested before in migraine and has the potential to significantly improve insurance coverage for nerve block injections.

PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Last year, Jan and Tom Lewis committed an additional \$3 million in support of headache care at Barrow. In honor of their generosity, the Institute and Foundation renamed the Jan and Tom Lewis Migraine Treatment Program as the Lewis Headache Center to reflect a broadening of patient care and research for headache conditions.

The Lewis Headache Center welcomed several new team members last year. In August 2021, licensed physical therapist and certified yoga therapist Juliana Kroese joined the headache team. Since her arrival, more patients have been utilizing headache-specific physical therapy services, and the Center has enlisted Barrow outpatient rehabilitation physical therapists Mindy Holleran and Kitty Minor to see the overflow of patients. The team also welcomed a new physician assistant, Nicholaus Scarfo, MPAS, PA-C, and a new headache fellow, Mustafa Yehya, MD.

The Center has seen an increase in headache patients utilizing social work services. Social worker Sadie Kleiman provides headache patients with important resources and information, including how to navigate benefits and FMLA at work, medication costs, and issues with transportation to appointments. The Center also launched a quarterly newsletter, which

covers topics such as lifestyle changes to better manage headache pain, tips to reduce stress, yoga updates, clinical trial updates, headache resources, and more.

EDUCATION AND OUTREACH



The Lewis Headache Center is dedicated to raising awareness and elevating the topic of migraine in the community. In March 2022, Barrow headache specialists, team members, and supporters gathered at Kiwanis Park in Tempe, Arizona,

to participate in the sixth annual Miles for Migraine 5K run, walk, or relax event. Funds raised through this event went toward migraine research at the Lewis Headache Center and other local medical centers.

In October 2022, the Center held its first Headache Education Symposium for Patients. The daylong, in-person event covered topics such as approaches to migraine and headache treatment, physical therapy and wellness, headache and nutrition, and pain psychology, followed by a yoga class and meditation. Those in attendance appreciated the diversity of speakers, learning about new medications and therapies, and connecting with other headache patients.

ON THE HORIZON

The Lewis Headache Center plans to continue expanding patient care and research by recruiting for the following positions:

- A translational research scientist, who will design and execute headachespecific trials, allowing the Center to grow its clinical trial portfolio.
- A headache psychologist, who will play a critical role in the wellness program, as anxiety and depression commonly occur with migraine and can hinder patients in managing their headache.
- A second headache physical therapist, who will see the additional overflow of patients.
