Email Signature and Gmail Settings

Preferred Email Signature (All Employees)

Gmail settings (settings > general > signature). If you have already set up your signature in Outlook, styled as shown below, you can copy and paste it into the signature window in Gmail settings. If you have not alreay set a signature you will need to click "create new" and follow the steps. After you are done with the signature settings scroll to bottom and click "save changes."





At this time please refrain from using any logos in your email signature.

Use the Dignity Health Domain for Day-to-Day Email Correspondence (or @BarrowNeuro.org for those users)


The transition to Google has caused some confusion with regard to what email address to use. These guidelines will help you to appropriately use your current email addresses:

With the transition to Google, you now have an @commonspirit.org domain. This should be used to log into your Google profile.

For divisional day-to-day email correspondence, as well as patient-facing communications, you should continue to use the regional domain (@dignityhealth.org). (Or @BarrowNeuro.org for those users)

With these guidelines in mind, please set your local domain as your default email address in the appropriate Gmail settings (settings > accounts > send mail as > add another email address).

After you have added your @dignityhealth.org email address (or @BarrowNeuro.org) it will show up as another choice for the "Send mail as" section. Next to your @dignityhealth.org email address click "make default" then scroll down to bottom and click "Save."







Javier Cárdenas, MD Neurologist Concussion and Brain Iniury

Javier Cárdenas, MD, is a neurologist and the director of the Barrow Concussion and Brain Injury Center. He is board certified in neurology by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology.

Dr. Cárdenas' expertise involves concussion, post- concussion syndrome, spinal trauma, and traumatic brain injury. He is a member of the American Academy of Neurology; the National Football League Head, Neck and Spine Committee; and the Arizona Governor's Advisory Council on Spinal and Head Injuries.

Dr. Cárdenas received his medical degree from the University of Arizona College of Medicine. He completed a residency in pediatrics at St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center and trained in child neurology at Barrow Neurological Institute.

Dr. Cárdenas created the Barrow Concussion and Brain Injury Center, which is the nation's most comprehensive concussion prevention, treatment, and education program. He also created Barrow Brainbook, which Arizona high school students must complete to participate in school sports. It is the first mandated online concussion education and testing tool for student athletes in the country.

Holly A. Shill, MD, is the Director of Muhammad Ali Parkinson Center at Barrow Neurological Institute. She is board certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology. Dr. Shill is also a Research Associate Professor in the Department of Neurology, University of Arizona College of Medicine in Phoenix.


Dr. Shill's expertise includes the diagnosis and treatment of involuntary movements, tremor disorders, Parkinson's disease, Huntington's disease, Dystonia and Ataxia. She is a member of the American Academy of Neurology and Movement Disorder Society.

Dr. Shill received her medical degree from the University of Arizona, College of Medicine. She completed her internship at St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center in Internal Medicine. Dr. Shill completed her residency in neurology and a fellowship in movement disorders at Barrow Neurological Institute. She then served as a clinical fellow at the National Institutes of Health, studying movement disorders.

Dr. Shill's research interests include risk factors for the development and progression of Parkinson's disease, the pathogenesis of Essential Tremor and innovative treatments for both Parkinson's and Essential Tremor.

Terry D. Fife, MD, is the Director of the Balance Disorders and Vestibular Neurology program at Barrow Neurological Institute. He is board certified in both internal medicine and in neurology.

Dr. Fife specializes in disorders of balance and equilibrium including vertigo, cerebellar ataxia, chronic imbalance, hydrocephalus, recurrent falling, syncope and postural hypotension, dizziness, and nystagmus and eye movement disorders. His research interests include the diagnosis and management of vertigo and equilibrium disorders, testing of balance and vestibular function and cerebellar ataxia.

Dr. Fife is a past president of the Arizona Neurological Society and serves on a number of National Committees. He has published articles on topics related to balance disorders and is a reviewer for numerous journals on topics of balance and vertigo.

After completing medical school at Texas A&M University, Dr. Fife completed an internal medicine residency program at the University of California, Davis and then completed neurology training at UCLA. He then completed fellowship training in neuro-otology and balance disorders at UCLA on an NIH National Research Service Award.



How to Reference "Barrow" & Naming Conventions for Donor Gifts

How to Reference "Barrow"

- NEVER "Barrows" or "Barrows Neuro" or "Barrows Neurological Institute."
- NEVER "Barrow's" with an apostrophe "s."
- NEVER "The" Barrow with exception of resident and fellowship marketing.
- In collateral pieces, refer to "Barrow Neurological Institute" as a first mention. After that, use only "Barrow" in place of "Barrow Neurological Institute" going forward.
- Avoid abbreviations "BNI" and "BNF" can only be used internally.
- BESTU, BIC, MAPC avoid acronyms always.

Naming Conventions for Donor Gifts

The approved naming convention for all named Barrow Neurological Institute donor spaces shall be: Last Name Center/Space

For example: Petznick Stroke Center, Sonntag Spine Center, Marley Lobby

Current donor spaces are grandfathered in with full names, e.g., Muhammad Ali Parkinson Center, Gregory W. Fulton ALS Center

Donor-named service lines and spaces shall be included in the first reference on all copy, media releases, etc., and must include the copy "at Barrow Neurological Institute" following the proper name.

For example: Petznick Stroke Center at Barrow Neurological Center or Sonntag Spine Center at Barrow Neurological Institute


